Instructions Concerning blood thinners For Pre-Operative Patients

Patients who are preparing for surgery should stop using all products containing aspirin and certain other related anti-inflammatory medications. Aspirin is a strong anti-coagulant which can cause bleeding problems during or following surgery even in normal, healthy individuals. It is therefore important that you <u>STOP aspirin and other related products for 7-10 days prior to your surgery.</u> You can generally resume taking the product 3-5 days after surgery. **If your Internist or another physician has prescribed these products for health reasons, please bring it to our attention. In these cases it is necessary to consult with your physician and obtain your physician's approval and instructions before stopping these medications.** We advise patients to stop any medication that can increase bleeding to make your surgery safer, however; stopping any medication prescribed by your physician can carry significant risks including but not limited to the following: stroke, heart attack, blood clots etc.. Be sure to check the label of all medications.
